12 NIGHTS 13 DAYS

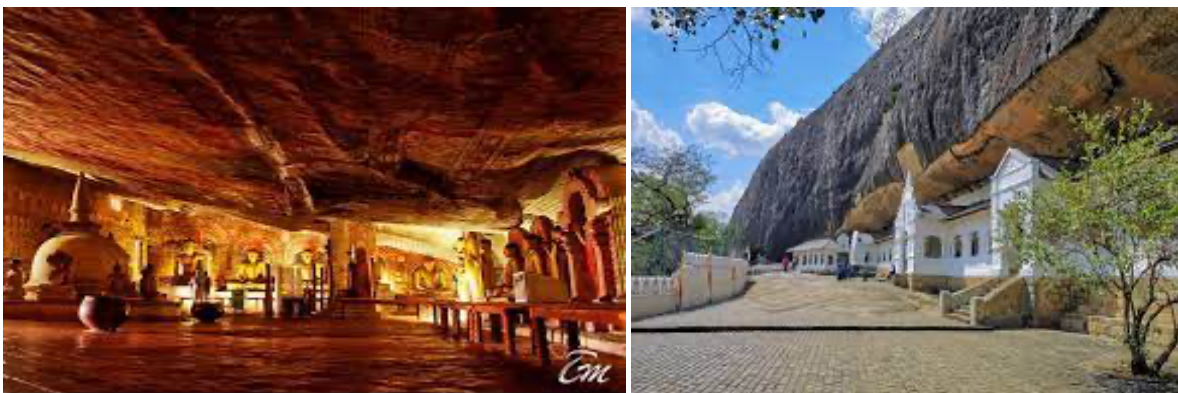
Sri Lanka is a relatively small island – approximately 65,525 sq. Kilometers’ – but within its palm-fringed shores, it offers an astonishing diversity of landscapes, flora and fauna, religions and cultures. It is a land of outstanding beauty, from the verdant lowland jungles and farmland to the misty highlands, covered in places by perfectly manicured tea plantations. Once away from the tourist honey-pots, visitors are assured of a genuinely warm welcome

DAY 01.

Katunayake (Airport) / dambulla

Arrival, meeting & assistant and welcome service at airport then transfer to Dambulla

Dambulla is the largest and best-preserved cave temple complex in Sri Lanka. The rock towers 160 m over the surrounding plains. There are more than 80 documented caves in the surrounding area. Major attractions are spread over five caves, which contain statues and paintings. These paintings and statues are related to [Gautama Buddha](#) and his life. There are a total of 153 Buddha statues, three statues of Sri Lankan kings and four statues of [gods and goddesses](#).

Day 02.

Set in the heart of the popular cultural triangle of Sri Lanka, Minneriya National Park is mostly known for its incredible elephant migration, which is one of Asia's finest wildlife experiences. During the drier months of June to September, as many as 300 elephants congregate in the Minneriya National Park around. Which has been declared as the largest elephant gathering in the world. the ancient Minneriya water tank (which dates to 3rd Century AD), taking advantage of the receding waters that provide an important water source.



Day 03 & 04.

Dabulla / Anuradhapura

This morning after your breakfast you will be proceed to Anuradhapura

Anuradhapura is the 1st capital of Sri Lanka. One of the ancient cities in Sri Lanka, well known for its ruins depicting early Sri Lankan civilization. It is very famous among Buddhists pilgrims. Anuradhapura was earlier the capital of the Island (in ancient times) and most of the Kings who ruled Sri Lanka resided in this vast city. The city is now named as a world heritage site by UNESCO.

Day 05.

This morning after the breakfast you will be proceed to Trincomalee

Trincomalee is a port city on the northeast coast of Sri Lanka. Set on a peninsula, Fort Frederick was built by the Portuguese in the 17th century. Within its grounds, the grand Koneswaran Temple stands on Swami Rock cliff.

Koneswaran Temple of Trincomalee or Thirukonamalai Konesar Temple – The Temple of the Thousand Pillars and Dakshina-Then Kailasam is a classical-medieval Hindu temple complex in Trincomalee, a Hindu religious pilgrimage centre in Eastern Province, Sri Lanka.

Day 06,

After the breakfast proceed to Kandy

Overnight stay at Gims farm villas Madawala



A safari in the Kaudulla national park in Sri Lanka is a bucket-list aspiration for many tourists, which mean the place is an absolutely incredible wildlife spectacle. Located in the historic city of Polonnaruwa in Sri Lanka, Kaudulla national park presents an ample of opportunities for travelers to spot majestic elephants in their natural habitats. In addition to the elephants, sambar deer, Sri Lankan axis deer, chevrotain, wild boar, Asian spoonbill, grey-headed fish eagle, painted stork and openbill stork are common visuals at the park.



Day 07,

Matale /Nuwaraeliya

This morning after your breakfast you will be proceed to Nuwaraeliya via Kandy

Dubbed "Little England" due to its cool climate and colonial-era bungalows, Nuwaraeliya boasts a landscape far more dramatic than Britain's. Mist-shrouded mountains and terraced tea plantations surround the former hill station, while world-class brews are abundant. & you can enjoy your lunch / snacks at safe & secure restaurants while on tour.

Day 08 & 09, 10

Nuwaraeliya /Tangalle

Strung out along one of the South's most stunning stretches of coastline, **TANGALLE** (or Tangalle) is among the region's more developed beach destinations, with a string of simple guesthouses – and a handful of upmarket hotels (5 Star*) and villas – dotted along the coves and beaches which line the oceanfront here.

Optional Visit -Yala National Park is Sri Lanka's most popular wildlife park due to the presence of many leopards. [Sri Lanka](#) is one of the few countries in the world where the population lives side-by-side with free-roaming animals. It isn't uncommon to see elephants crossing roads or sneaking into a hotel lobby – a unique and beautiful way of living.



Overnight stay at **Buckingham Place in Tangalle**

Day 11 & 12

Tangalle /Galle

Founded in the 16th century by the Portuguese, Galle reached the height of its development in the 18th century, before the arrival of the British. It is the best example of a fortified city built by Europeans in South and South-East Asia, showing the interaction between European architectural styles and South Asian traditions.
